



Common Lawn Problems and Solutions

<p>Year Round Ants</p>	<p>Use your favorite ant bait or an organic approach using Horticultural Molasses/dry Molasses</p>
<p>August-October Sod Webworms</p>	<p>You will see little clouds of white moths while walking through the lawn. Their caterpillars can eat an entire lawn in a week. Treat with BT or Spinosad Soap. Spray Soil Activator on any hard hit areas to encourage new growth.</p>
<p>Warm Months April-Sept</p>	<p>Look out for Chinch bugs. Usually occur in over dry lawns, water regularly. If you get them treat with Organicide.</p>
<p>October-March Brown Patch</p>	<p>Brown Patch is a fungus that causes circular discoloration. Prevent by doing you compost top dressings regularly (see organic lawn program). Treat with MicroLife Brown Patch if it does occur and use Ocean Harvest spray on grass near the effected area to encourage new growth.</p>
<p>Flooded/Long Periods of Rain</p>	<p>Treatment: Apply Humates plus and Medina Soil Activator to add oxygen and microbes back into the soil.</p>
<p>Laying New Sod</p>	<p>Put down a layer of Nature's Way Resource Leaf Mold compost under each piece of sod. Follow up with a Foliar spray such as Super Seaweed or Ocean Harvest for a quick green up.</p>
